Mass Intentions

Some people have been asking when their submitted Mass intention will be celebrated. At last count we have just over 110 Mass Intentions outstanding and at the rate of 5/week, it will take 22 weeks for all these intentions to be satisfied. We try to honor specific date requests if possible when the date is available, but because of the backlog, it is often impossible to honor all requests on the dates specified. We generally schedule them in the order that they are received. According to Canon Law, only one intention at a time can be offered each day by any priest. If we have a funeral on any given day, that Mass is reserved for the person who died, so that is one less that can be taken off the list. Other Churches like the Cathedral that receive many requests have gone to publishing all the requested Masses each week in their bulletin and lumping them all together during the month. We will be investigating potential other methods for dealing with the over abundance of Mass requests. In the mean time, please be patient.

They will be available hanging on the coat rack to the right of the holy water fountain on the way into church. To activate your unit press the power button until the 'CH 1" indicator shows in the little window. The "Vol +" and "Vol -" buttons allow you to adjust the volume to a comfortable level for yourself. To turn it off after Mass, press the "Power" button again until the display clears. You should not need to push any of the other buttons. If you do let

Fr. Joe know so he can reprogram the device. Please be sure the "Power" is off by making sure nothing is displayed in the window, otherwise the batteries will be unnecessarily drained. If your batteries are dead, Fr. Joe has a supply of them by his vesting station.

CATHOLIC MUTUAL GROUP

Our annual Catholic Mutual Multi-Peril insurance bills just came and unfortunately Immaculate Conception's went up significantly. It will cost us **\$38,180** for the year. That is approximately 3 months worth of Sunday collections fpr our church. According to Catholic Mutual: *"This last year has been one of our most challenging years in the insurance industry. Due to losses and inflationary pressures, we had no choice but to pass increases on to our members."* For some reason, St. Theodore's bill went down a few hundred dollars to **\$1,409**, so there is some good news.
