



We had 20 people show up for the last session on "Ars Moriendi" (the "Art of Dying"). Deacon Paul gave a recap of the session from the prior week for those that weren't present then. Then he went into more detail on the best practices for preparing for death, something most people don't even want to talk about. Best Catholic practices as you get near death are: sincere reception of the sacrament of Confession, participating in Mass and receiving the Eucharist, receiving the Anointing of the Sick. He handed out an outline of additional best practices with special prayers just for the final days/hours of life. His original source for the material is the "Ars Moriendi" book from 1450 that was copied from the British Museum by George Bullen published in 1881. The book was created from wood carvings before the printing press was invented and next to the Bible was the most widely popular book of the time.
