Last week on retreat I was reminded once again of the necessity of silence for developing a life of faith, or indeed any kind of peaceful, recollected life at all. Our culture constantly bombards us with noise. Billboards, commercials, phone alerts, ads on web pages, every form of social media: all just noise meant to distract us, to keep our minds unfocused and bouncing between purely worldly concerns. This is a very intentional tactic of the devil. He knows the necessity of silence in our lives, and wants to make sure we never get it. Because without silence we are incapable of decisive action. Silence allows us to focus, provides the space we need to know ourselves, to understand our own desires, and distinguish them from our true needs. Noise keeps us living on the surface, silence opens the depths of our souls. And in this depth we can encounter God. He is not outside of us, waiting for us to find Him so that He can speak into our lives. He is already inside, speaking, leading, inviting us to live well with Him. But we need to go beyond the surface-level passions and urges in order to hear His voice. Only then can we find peace as we become who we truly are.

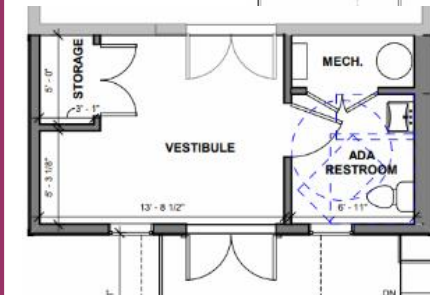
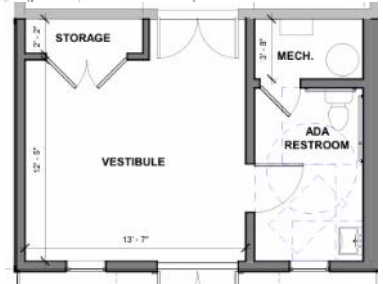

SACRAMENTAL INFORMATION

Infant Baptism: Parents must be registered & active members of this parish or of another parish with family here in the parish (i.e., parents). Letter of permission from Pastor if parents are from outside the parish. Two Godparents who are registered and active members of their parish, one male and one female. Contact the Pastor before infant's due date to arrange date and time.

Holy Matrimony: Couples discerning this sacrament should contact the Pastor immediately after becoming engaged. NOTE: the diocese requires a minimum of 6 months advance notice regarding the intention to marry. Couples wishing to marry in the parish must be registered and active members of the parish, or individuals who have moved away whose parents are still active in the parish. Couples from other parishes must obtain a letter of permission to marry outside of their own parish.

Anointing of the Sick: Individuals who have been diagnosed as terminally or gravely ill or are preparing for invasive surgery should request this sacrament. Confession ordinarily proceeds receiving the sacrament of the sick, call the church office at 846-4114 to make arrangements.

Adult Confirmation, Adult Baptism (RCIA), and Adult Reception into Full Communion with the Church: If you, a family member, or a friend has not received the sacrament of confirmation, or are interested in being baptized into the Faith, or received into full communion with the Church, please contact the Pastor. Process will be discerned on an individual basis based on preparedness.
